The **Pratt Music Foundation** Scholarship class of 2014-15 includes twenty-one students from Bloomington and nine from Normal. Eleven students are studying violin, two study viola, four study cello, and thirteen are studying piano. Thirteen students attend **District 87** schools, ten attend **Unit 5** schools, three attend private school, and four are home-schooled.

The 30 **Pratt Music Foundation** Scholars for 2014-15 is an investment of \$37,500 in the next generation of music in our community.

"I didn't understand at the time what music would mean to me."

Ramone Pippins sat across from me at the coffee shop as we discussed his life since graduation eight years ago. He shared, "I didn't understand how important music would become in my life."

Ramone was one of the first **Pratt Music Foundation** Scholars in 1997, then a fifth grader at Sheridan School; he kept up his violin lessons for eight years and graduated high school in 2006 with dreams of college football. He played a season at Quincy University, and then dropped out to work and attend classes at Heartland Community College. He also played semi-pro football until he hurt his knee.

"I hadn't given music a thought for three full years, but as I was recovering, I started listening to classical music again. It calmed me; it helped me recover; and it motivated me."

Ramone returned to his violin. He learned drums and found that he enjoyed performing. "I can pretty much pick up any instrument and play it: guitar, piano, bass,

drums. I owe that to Miss Ehrlich; she always kept encouraging me. I understand that now."

Ramone has a rapport with the teens at church and they respond well to him; some take turns playing with his group. "I have this dream of planting praise music groups in churches."
